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Dear Parent / Carers,

Yet another half term has flown by! I write this as the sun is shining, melting away the morning frost and glimmers of spring are starting to appear. We are now officially just over halfway through this academic year and there are lots of updates to share with you below.

Teaching and Learning Update

Recently we have been interviewing students to ask them their opinions about the quality of teaching and learning at The Prescot School. We do this as part of our quality assurance process for teaching and learning. Seeing teachers teach, looking at students' books and hearing what our students have to say about their learning, are all great ways for us to identify strengths and our next areas for development.

Students are overwhelmingly positive about how hard teachers work to make lessons interesting and support them in their learning. I have included some positive comments from their feedback below:

- 'The work is challenging but Sir breaks it down into small steps, so we all understand.'
- 'Learning about different religions is really important as it helps you understand what's going on in the world '
- 'Miss has made me realise how important it is to do extra work at home if I want to do well in my exams.'
- 'I like it when we work independently because you really have to think.'
- I have learned how important it is to see both sides of a situation by studying History.'

Character Development at The Prescot School

We are introducing a new Character Development Program called "Make it Matter" to be delivered during form time after half term. As well as reinforcing key messages delivered through assemblies, it will equip students with the language, knowledge, understanding, skills and attributes that enable character development and allow them to explore, understand and practise difficult concepts that strengthen character. Student, staff and parent/carer voice has helped shape this program. We really look forward to watching this develop in the coming months and encourage you to speak to your child each week about the content of their sessions.

ClassCharts

As you are aware, the school uses "ClassCharts" as a way for staff to record good behaviour or any student issues within school.

There is a parent / carer version of the app, which allows parents / carers to view their child's progress in real time. This includes information such as up-to-date attendance and punctuality records, timetables, positive and negative behaviour points. The school also uses ClassCharts as its main way to communicate with parents / carers and students. Notices and letters are sent out via the app too.

We know that approximately 150 parents / carers are not accessing the app and therefore may be at risk of missing out on vital communications regarding school logistics and news, as well as updates on their child's progress.
