TRANSITION TO SECONDARY SCHOOL

It is very important to us and our partner primary schools that transition from Year 6 to Year 7 is a positive and smooth experience.

We invest dedicated time and resources to ensure that every child continues on their learning journey via a well-planned transition programme. This programme has the needs of each Year 6 child at its core.

PASTORAL TEAM

Our students are divided into year groups led by a Head of Year.

Year 7 students are also supported by an Assistant Head of Year and a Year 7 Pastoral Assistant to help them to settle into secondary school life.

The pastoral team work to support students, staff and families. They have extensive experience in resolving a wide variety of issues which can occur in school. They help students to become resilient and independent young people who are able to excel in school.

MENTORING AND COUNSELLING

We have a learning mentor and two school counsellors at The Prescot School, who work to support students in any way they can.

April 2024 onwards

The Year 7 team will visit your child in their primary school. During this time, your child will be given information about life at The Prescot School and have the opportunity to have their questions answered.

July 2024

Induction Day – Your child will be invited to The Prescot School as part of an induction where they will meet their Head of Year as well as other students in their form. The day will consist of team building activities as well as Key Stage 3 taster sessions, which may include Science, Technology and Maths (STEM) as well as English, Drama and Modern Languages etc.

Induction Evening – Families and students will be invited to visit the school. You and your child will have the opportunity to meet a variety of staff and will be provided with a blazer and bag with pencil case.

Transition Information – Students and families transitioning to Year 7 will have access to a wealth of information on our website to support a pleasant transition to secondary school.

Summer School - Each year we run a Summer School, which Year 6 students are invited to attend. Summer School provides a wonderful opportunity for students to familiarise themselves with staff, the building and the rest of their year group.

Students will have the opportunity to attend a team and character building trip in the first term after joining us.

KNOWLEDGE ORGANISERS

At The Prescot School we have built a five-year curriculum plan which builds effective revision strategies into homework and lessons.

At the start of every new term, students in Year 7 to 9 are given a Knowledge Organiser for each subject. This booklet provides them with all the knowledge that they will need to succeed in their learning during that term. Learning this information will allow them to deepen their subject knowledge and make better progress.

Knowledge Organisers are also a brilliant tool for families to understand exactly what is being taught.
